One-Design Classes: J/105, J/70, Viper 640, Etchells, IOD, Shields, S-Boat, Ideal 18, RSK6, Vanguard 15, Club 420, Laser, Laser Radial, Optimist and Optimist Green

1 RULES

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*, the current IRC Rules and the current PHRF Regulations as administered by the YRA of LIS.

1.2 All keelboats are required to carry a radio capable of transmitting and receiving on VHF channel 73 or as stated in the sailing instructions.

1.3 Sections A, B and D of Appendix T will apply, as changed:

(i) T1 is changed to:

The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 in an incident while *racing* or rule 31. However, when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 in an incident while in the *zone* around a *mark*

- other than a starting *mark*, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.'
- (ii) T2.2 is changed as follows:
- (a)) 30%, if taken before the protest time limit and before the beginning of arbitration or a protest hearing involving the incident.
 - (b) 40%, if taken before the beginning of a protest hearing involving the incident.

2 ENTRIES

- 2.1 Eligible boats may enter by registering online at www.yachtscoring.com. Entry deadline is 1700 Friday September 5, 2014.
- 2.2 The Entry Fee will include one (1) ticket for the family Pig Roast and Silent Auction on Saturday, September 6, 2014. Additional tickets are \$75.00.

- 2.3 At the discretion of the race committee, divisions may be subdivided into classes.
- 2.4 The non-spinnaker division is open to boats with a PHRF rating of 50 and above. Both the Non-Spinnaker and the Double-handed divisions will be scored PHRF.
- 2.5 All handicapped entries must be submitted with their PHRF or IRC rating. IRC certificates do not need to be endorsed. Boats without a PHRF rating will be assigned a rating based upon similar boats. The rating assigned by the race committee will not be grounds for redress. This changes rule 62.1
- 2.6 Preliminary scratch sheets listing the boats by their divisions and class will be available online or at the front desk by 1800 the day before the race and before the starting sequence from a committee boat.

3 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available on the Larchmont Yacht Club website: www.larchmontyc.org or www.yachtscoring.com, and at the front desk of the Larchmont Yacht Club no later than Friday, September 5, 2014, and will also be available at the registration.

5 START AND FINISH

The starting and finish lines will be located south of the Larchmont Breakwater.

6 COURSES

The courses will be as described in the sailing instructions.

7 SCORING

- 7.1 For PHRF boats, time allowances will be computed using time on distance.
- 7.2 For IRC boats, the boat's rating allowance will be applied as a factor of the elapsed time.
- 7.3 Boats sailing one-design level racing will be scored by class.

7.4 A boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

8 PRIZES

Series prizes will be awarded to the first three finishers in each division if there are four or more entries in that division.

9 GUEST MOORINGS AND PRIVILEGES

9.2 The privileges of the Club will be extended to owners and crews of competing boats.
