NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 Sections A, B and D of Appendix T will apply as changed:
 - (i) Appendix T1 of Section A is deleted and replaced with:
The first two sentences of rule 44.1 are changed to: 'A boat may take a One-turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 in an incident or rule 31 while *racing*. However, when she may have broken one or more rules of Part 2 in an incident while in the *zone* around a *mark* other than a starting *mark*, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty.'
 - (ii) Rule T2.2 of Section B is changed thus:
 - (a) 20% if taken before the protest time limit or before the beginning of arbitration, whichever is earlier, or
 - (b) 30% if taken before the beginning of a protest hearing involving the incident.

2 CLASSES

The regatta is open to the following one-design classes: Viper 640, J70, K6, Melges 20 and Melges 24. To qualify as a class for this regatta 3 valid entries must be received for that class prior to 1700 Thursday, May 14, 2015.

3 ENTRIES & FEES

- 3.1 All eligible boats may enter using the on line entry at:
<http://www.yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=1291>. Entry deadline 1700 Thursday, May 21, 2015.
- 3.2 The entry fee is:
 - \$ 75.00 per two-person boat
 - \$100.00 per three-person boat
 - \$125.00 per four-person boat
 The entry fee includes racing, and keg beer each day.
Completed entries and fees must be received no later than 1700, Thursday, May 21, 2015

5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing instructions will be available online no later than 1800 Weds. May 20.

6 COURSES AND RACES

- 6.1 Courses may be windward-leeward, Gold Cup, Olympic triangle, and/or trapezoid, and will be described in the sailing instructions.
- 6.2 The race committee intends to run multiple races each day

7 RACE AREA

The race area will be in the waters off of Larchmont Harbor.

8 SCORING

- 8.1 One completed race constitutes a series.
- 8.2 If fewer than five races are completed a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 8.3 If five or more races are completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score subject to rule 90.3 (b).

9 PRIZES

- 9.1 Series prizes will be awarded following the conclusion of racing on Sunday, May 24 on the front lawn of the Larchmont Yacht Club.
- 9.2 First place for all classes with at least three competing boats.
Second place for all classes with at least four competing boats.
Third place for all classes with five or more competing boats.

10 GUEST MOORINGS, USE OF HOISTS AND PRIVILEGES

Guest moorings will be available on a first come basis. Please contact the Waterfront Director, Larchmont Yacht Club for reservations 914-468-7742 or marinefacilities@larchmontyc.org. The Club's hoists will be available for launching and taking out visiting boats. Dry sailed boats may be parked at the owners' risk on trailers in the boat yard from May 22 to May 25, 2015.
