SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Newport Classic Yacht Regatta presented by IYRS (NCYR) is part of the Classic Yachts Challenge Series (CYCS)

The Organizing Authority (OA) is Ida Lewis Yacht Club.

1. RULES

- **1.1.** The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS 2017-2020), and the 2020 Classic Yachts Challenge Series Notice of Series.
- **1.2.** For the purposes of rules 14 and 44.1, any contact between boats shall be considered serious damage. This changes rule 44.1.
- **1.3.** In the event of a conflict between the Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SI), the SI's shall prevail. This changes rule 63.7.
- **1.4.** Crew Waiver: No crew shall be aboard a yacht while racing unless he/she has executed an on line Crew Waiver Form. Registration will not be complete with out receipt of a Crew Waiver Form from each person competing.
- **1.5.** A boat touching the Race Committee signal boat or the buoys attached to the signal boat at any time will be scored DSQ for that race without a hearing. This changes RRS 63.1 and A5.

- **2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS:** Notices to competitors, including protest notices, will be posted on the official notice board located online at the Yacht Scoring Official Notice Board.
- **3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:** Any changes in the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board before 0830 hrs on Sunday, September 6th.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made a shore will be displayed from the Ida Lewis Yacht Club flag pole.
- **4.2.** When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1minute" is replaced with "not less than 45 minutes" in the race signal AP; and an announcement regarding the Race Committee intentions will be made on VHF channel 79A.
- **4.3.** The Race Committee will make announcements concerning postponements, courses, premature starters, etc., on VHF Channel 79A. Failure of the Race Committee to make such announcements, or failure of competitors to receive or hear such announcements will not be grounds for redress.

5. SCHEDULE

Sunday, September 6

0730-0830 Check-in for NCYR at Restoration Hall at IYRS, Newport.

ONLY ONE REPRESENTATIVE PER BOAT, PLEASE.

- 0930 Mandatory Skippers' Meeting on VHF Channel 79A. The RC will conduct a role call.
- 1015 Yacht Parade (line up at south end of Goat Island)
- First Warning Signal for handicap classes

First Warning Signal for Day Racer, One Design and Formula classes will follow the last handicap class start by approximately 10 minutes.

6. CLASS FLAGS

- **6.1.** An amendment will be posted online on the Official Notice Board listing the classes, anticipated starting order, ratings if applicable and class flags by 1000 on Sunday September 6. Please be aware that boats in different divisions may be in the same start, and that not all the boats in a division may be in the same start.
- **6.2.** Each boat shall start in the starting group they are assigned.

6.3. While racing, each boat shall display the numerical pennant for her respective division from her backstay no less than six (6) feet above the deck.

7. CHECK IN AND RETIREMENT

- **7.1.** Prior to the first warning signal, all boats shall check in with the Race Committee by hailing the Race Committee on VHF CHANNEL 69 with their boat name and sail number until the Race Committee affirmatively acknowledges the check in.
- **7.2.** Boats retiring from racing before finishing shall inform the Race Committee by contacting the on VHF Channel 79A.

8. RACING AREA

- **8.1.** The waters of Narragansett Bay and Rhode Island Sound.
- **8.2.** Boats will rendezvous between Rose and Goat Islands.

9. THE COURSES

- **9.1.** The courses will be navigator courses chosen by the Race Committee using the South Bay Race Chart (a copy of which is available online on the Official Notice Board) buoys plus the additional marks listed below.
- **9.2.** The Course for each starting group will be posted on a white board on the starboard side of the Race Committee Signal Boat no later than the warning signal, and will be announced on VHF channel 79A.
- **9.3.** Additional marks not displayed on the South Bay Race Chart:

Special Race Mark: The Race Committee may elect to position a special mark to achieve a particular course configuration. If used, the distance and bearing to the special mark from the committee boat or from the prior mark will be displayed below the posted course. In some cases, the direct line from the committee boat to the special mark may be across land:

- 1. Special Race Marks #1 and #2 will be Yellow Tetrahedrons.
- 2. Special Race Mark #3 will be a large Orange Round Mark (Dumpy).

Marks for each course will be posted on a white board from the committee boat in order of rounding, with the subscript for each mark designating the required side, P means leave to Port, and S means leave to starboard. The race committee will also announce the courses on VHF 79A.

Marks to be Observed: Passage under the Newport Pell Bridge and/or the Jamestown Verrazano Bridge shall be made through the center spans only. For purposes of RRS32.2(c), the center span of the both bridges shall be considered gates.

THE START

- 10.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS26.
- **10.2** The starting line will be between the orange flag on the committee boat and the nearby mark.
- **10.3** Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other starting groups.
- **10.4** A boat that does not start within 10minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 10.5 Crews must maintain appropriate social distancing and/or wear appropriate face coverings at all times, including the period prior to their start sequence and during their starting sequence.

11. THE FINISH

- **11.1.** The finish line will be between a staff flying a solid blue flag on the Race Committee Boat and a nearby inflatable mark.
- **11.2.** The Race Committee intends to locate the finish line in the approximate vicinity of the starting line.

12. PENALTY SYSTEM

- **12.1.** The Scoring Penalty of rule 44.3 will apply. The penalty shall be 20% of the number of boats entered in the applicable class. The minimum penalty shall be two (2) places.
- **12.2.** The penalty, if any, for a violation of a rule other than a rule of Part2, shall beat the sole discretion of the Protest Committee, and may be other than disqualification. This changes rule 64.1.
- 13. TIME LIMIT The time limit for each class shall be 5 hours.

14. PROTESTS

- **14.1.** A yacht's intention to protest shall be communicated to the Race Committee upon finishing the race in which the protest occurred. This modifies RRS61.1(a).
- **14.2.** Protest forms will be available from the Protest Secretary located at IYRS. Written protests shall be submitted as soon as possible, but no later than one hour after the docking of the Race Committee Signal Boat. The protest time limit will be posted on the Official Notice Board.

- **14.3.** Protest notices will be posted as soon as possible and the Protest Committee will attempt to hear protests in the order of receipt. Representatives of yachts who are parties to a hearing shall remain on call in the vicinity of Restoration Hall at IYRS.
- **14.4.** When a yacht has been involved in an incident that may be subject to protest, it is her responsibility to check the protest notices at the end of the protest time limit to see if she is cited in a protest. Failure of any yacht to appear when called for a hearing will be considered by the Protest Committee as grounds for proceeding under RRS63.3(b).
- **14.5.** RRS63.5 is modified by adding,"A protest involving contact may be heard by the Protest Committee even if the requirements of RRS61.1 (a) and 61.3 have not been fulfilled."
- **14.6.** The penalty for a yacht that has broken a rule other than a rule of Part2 shall be at the discretion of the Protest Committee and may be other than disqualification. This changes RRS64.1(a).
- **14.7.** Rating protests must be filed by 0900 on Sunday, September 6, 2020.

15. **SCORING**

- **15.1.** One completed race constitutes a series.
- 15.2. A boat's series score will be the total of all her race scores. This changes ruleA2.
- 15.3. Handicap classes will be scored based on 2020 CRF MkII ratings.
- 15.4. One-Design and Formula classes will be scored level.
- **15.5.** Boats eligible for the CYC Series will be scored in accordance with the 2020 CYC Series Regulations.

16. RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

- **16.1.** All boats must carry a radio capable of making and receiving VHF transmissions.
- **16.2.** Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make nor receive radio transmissions not available to all boats.
- 17. SAFETY All boats not within their starting sequence must stay well clear of the starting area. Boats failing to comply with this requirement may be protested by the Race Committee and risk a penalty assigned by the Protest Committee.

18. REGATTA RESULTS:

- **18.1** Regatta results will be posted on the Yacht Scoring Web site and the Official Notice Board.
