



2023 Transpacific Yacht Race Amendment #2 to the NOTICE OF RACE

January 26, 2023

The following revises 2023 Safety at Sea requirements:

8.1.3 Crew General Safety Training

At least 60 30% of a yacht's crew including the Person in Charge and watch captains shall have a valid certificate for:

- a) A US Sailing International Offshore Safety at Sea with Hands-on Training Course, or
- b) The combination of a US Sailing Hands-On Safety at Sea Course and the US Sailing Offshore Safety at Sea Online Supplemental Course both taken in the same calendar year, or
- b) The combination of a US Sailing Hands-On Safety at Sea Course and a US Sailing On-Line Offshore Safety at Sea course both taken in the same calendar year; or
- c) A World Sailing (ISAF) Approved Offshore Personal Survival Training Course certificate issued by another country, or
- e) The US Sailing Offshore Safety at Sea Course (in-person), or
- f) The US Sailing Online Offshore safety at Sea Course(Units 1-15)

For double-handed entries both crew members must meet this requirement.

8.1.4 Additional Training

An additional 30% of the crew shall have a valid certificate for:

- a) The US Sailing Offshore Safety at Sea Course (in-person), or
- b) The US Sailing Online Offshore Safety at Sea Course (Units 1-15)

The US Sailing International Offshore Safety at Sea with Hands-on Training and World Sailing (ISAF) Offshore Personal Sea Survival Courses meet and exceed this requirement. Note all course certificates are valid for five years.

c) At least two members of the crew must have current CPR and First Aid training certificates. A list of approved courses can be found at the bottom of this page: <u>US Sailing SER</u>
