NOTICE OF RACE



NOTE: It is the intention and goal of the organizing authority to hold this event as scheduled. COVID-19 may have restrictions. The situation will be continually monitored and any decisions that are made affecting the schedule of the event will be communicated with participants ASAP.

1 RULES

1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The class rules of the participating classes will apply and are located online as follows:

1.3 RRS 40.1 will apply.

1.4 RRS Appendix P will apply to all classes except 420 White Sail and Optimist Green and is amended as follows: P 2.3 is deleted, P2.2 will apply to the second and subsequent penalties.

1.5 RRS 63.1, A3 and A5 will be changed to permit scoring penalties for failure to comply with check-in/check-out procedures outlined in the Sailing Instructions.

1.6 RRS Appendix T will apply.

1.7 The Sail Canada prescriptions shall apply. https://www.sailing.ca/uploads/2022/03/sail_canada_prescriptions_2021_2024_14_03_2022.pdf

2 ADVERTISING

Advertising will be permitted in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20 Table 1.

3 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available after 11:00 am on July 21, 2022 at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm

3.2 The Sailing Instructions will consist of the instructions in RRS Appendix S, Standard Sailing Instructions, and supplementary sailing instructions that will be on the official notice boards located at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm and under the regatta tent.

4 COMMUNICATION

4.1 The online official notice board is located at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm and may also be posted under the Regatta Tent.

4.2 From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

5 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

5.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the Laser (ILCA 7), Laser Radial (ILCA 6), Laser 4.7 (ILCA 4), Club 420 Spinnaker, Club 420 White Sail and Optimist classes and any other class with at least five (5) entries.

5.2 To compete in the C420 Canadian Championship, both skipper and crew shall be members of the C420 Class Association.

5.3 Registration for this regatta may **only be completed ONLINE** at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm that will open on or before June 1, 2022. *Competitor & Parent Waiver includes review of concussion awareness resources and codes of conduct. For the C420 Canadian Championship, completion of the Dinghy Regatta safety Checklist must also be complete and a paper copy presented at registration. All are required in addition to payment of the prescribed fees to be fully registered.*

5.4 **Online registration will close at 11:55 pm Thursday, July 21, 2022.**

6.2 A full refund, less a \$25.00 processing fee, will be granted to those entries cancelled before July 12, 2022. A 50% refund of the registration fee will be granted to those entries cancelled before 11:59 pm Thursday, July 21, 2022. No refunds will be granted after 11:59 pm Thursday, July 21, 2022.

7 CREW LIMITATIONS

To compete in the C420 Canadian Championship, both skipper and crew shall be members in good standing with the C420 Class Association. Those competitors who are not members of the C420 Class Association will not be scored for the C420 Canadian Championship, only the Four Sisters Regatta.

8.2 Number of races

All Classes have a maximum of four (4) races per day, except Optimists who may race up to seven (7) per day.

9 VENUE

9.1 The racing areas will be on the waters of Lake Ontario adjacent to the Port Credit Yacht Club Harbour entrance and will be detailed in the Supplementary Sailing Instructions.

10 COURSES

Courses to be sailed will be detailed in Appendix S and the Supplementary Sailing Instructions.

11 SCORING

11.1 One race is required to be complete to constitute a series.

11.2 (a) When fewer than five (5) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When five (5) to (9) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(c) When ten (10) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores, excluding her two worst scores.

11.3 Results will be available online at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm and may also be posted under the Regatta Tent.

12 SUPPORT BOATS AND COACH BOATS

12.1 [DP] **Support and Coach boats shall be identified and shall be equipped with VHF Radios.** When Code flag V is displayed, all Support and Coach Boats shall be utilized as safety boats and shall be under the direction of the Race Committee.

12.2 [DP] Registered Coaches will be provided with an identifying flag which they must display on their coach boats at all times while on the water. There will be a \$20 refundable deposit for the flag. **All coaches must register in Yacht Scoring.**

13 BERTHING AND CAMPING

13.1 [DP] Coach boats and dinghies must be kept in their assigned areas which will be designated in the Supplementary Sis and/or found at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm. All competitors and coaches must respect member's boats including wake reduction when leaving and entering the harbour.

13.2 [NP] If you are planning on using a visitor's dock at PCYC during the event, ensure that you book your spot with the Harbourmaster at harbourmaster@pcyc.net as space is limited.

13.3 [NP] Fuel may be obtained at the Lakefront Promenade Marina on **9am-7pm Friday to Sunday.**

13.4 [NP] Limited camping is available in designated areas only on a first come first serve basis. Anyone wishing to camp must complete the Camping Registration Application by July 19, 2022 at <https://pcyc.net/camping> and be accepted. Additional information can be found on the website. **All groups camping must have an adult chaperone on site at all times and provide onsite contact information. The committee reserves the right to deny camping privileges.** Additional accommodation options may be found in the information package at https://yachtscoring.com/select_event.cfm

14 CODE OF CONDUCT and CONCUSSION WAIVERS

The Sail Canada Code of Conduct for Competitors, Coaches and Parents will apply, along with the Code of Conduct for guests of Port Credit Yacht Club and the Province of Ontario

Concussion protocol document. This waiver is located in Yacht Scoring and will be required to be signed by the sailor and a parent/guardian to complete registration.

15 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY/RISK STATEMENT

The Racing Rules of Sailing 3 states, “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone”

By participating in this event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds, rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on unstable platforms and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the event.

16 INSURANCE

Each participating boat must be insured with valid third-party liability insurance or the equivalent.

17 PRIZES

16.1 There will be prize flags awarded to the first three finishers of each properly constituted class/division. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.

16.2 There will be prize flags for both skipper and crew awarded to the first five finishers and Top Juniors (both skipper and crew under 16 years) in the C420 Canadian Championship.

16.3 The following trophies will also be awarded:

- The Marilea McAllister Corinthian Spirit Award
- Top Overall Optimist Dinghy Sailor
