



# Antigua Bermuda Race 2023

May 9, 2023

## NOTICE OF RACE

1.0

### 1. MANAGEMENT

- 1.1 The Organizing Authority (“OA”) of the Antigua Bermuda Race 2023 (“the race”) is the Antigua Bermuda Race Organizing Committee (“ABC”) of The Royal Bermuda Yacht Club (“RBYC”), a member of the Bermuda Sailing Association. RBYC will be managing the race in affiliation with Antigua Sailing Week. The Pre-Race Headquarters will be located at Antigua Yacht Club, Antigua and the Race Headquarters at Royal Bermuda Yacht Club, Hamilton Bermuda.
- 1.2 The OA will have the authority to interpret the conditions governing the event and assign boats to divisions and classes. The OA reserves the right to accept or reject the entry of any boat.

### 2. RULES

The race will be governed by the following:

- 2.1 The rules, as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (“RRS”), including the [Bermuda Sailing Association prescriptions](#);
- 2.2 The CSA Rating Rule for boats in CSA Classes;
- 2.3 The PCS Multihull Rule for boats in multihull classes;
- 2.4 The CSA Classic Rating Rule for boats in the classic classes;
- 2.5 The IRC Rating Rule for boats in the IRC classes;

- 2.6 The ORCsy Rule for boats in the Superyacht Class
- 2.7 The International Super Yacht Rule (“ISYR”) for boats in the Spirit of Tradition Class.
- 2.8 The CAT 1 World Sailing Offshore Safety Requirements;  
Sec 3.29 Communications shall be amended to include  
“All yachts shall have aboard satellite communications capable of sending and receiving both voice and email messages. “
- 2.9 Under World Sailing Test Rule DR21-01, the definition of Start is changed as follows:  
Start: A boat starts when her hull having been entirely on the pre-start side of the starting line, and having complied with rule 30.1 if it applies, any part of her hull crosses the starting line from the pre-start side to the course side either:
- i. at or after her starting signal, or
  - ii. during the last ONE minute before her starting signal.
- When a boat starts in accordance with item (ii) of the definition Start, she shall not return to the prestart side of the line, and the starting penalty shall be 10 minutes added to her elapsed time without a hearing. This changes RRS 29.1, 30 and A5.1.
- 2.10 Boats in Divisions other than IRC may elect to use auxiliary propulsion during the race. They shall keep a log of their usage. This modifies RRS 42.
- 2.11 Power-driven winches and furlers, and mechanical and electro-mechanical steering devices will be permitted. This modifies RRS 52.
- 2.12 Rule 47, Trash Disposal, is changed by adding the following sentence: ‘However, discarding biodegradable, environmentally friendly bands when setting a sail is permitted.’
- 2.13 The Sailing Instructions may change other rules
- 2.14 Before the start of the race the Official Notice Board will be on the race website [www.antiquabermuda.com](http://www.antiquabermuda.com). After the start the Official Notice Board will be located at the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club and notices after the start may be posted on the race website. Failure to post notices on the race website after the start shall not be grounds for redress.
- 2.15 Before the start of the race and through to the finish the official time-zone is Atlantic Standard Time. After the finish, the official time-zone is Atlantic Daylight Time.

### **3. ADVERTISING**

- 3.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and provided by the OA as permitted by World Sailing Regulation 20

### **4. ELIGIBILITY**

#### 4.1 Yacht Eligibility

The regatta will be held for yachts with a minimum LOA of **35** feet and a minimum of two (2) crew in the following classes which may be subdivided;

- a) CSA Monohull
- b) PCS Multihull - Multihull
- c) CSA Classic
- d) IRC
- e) Superyacht
- f) Boats may enter multiple classes

- 4.2 The OA reserves the right to amalgamate, cancel, divide, sub-divide or rearrange classes at its sole discretion.

### **5. ENTRY, FEES & REGISTRATION**

- 5.1 Boats shall enter online at [www.antiguabermuda.com](http://www.antiguabermuda.com);

- 5.2 Entries will be accepted up to 5 pm on Tuesday, April 4, 2023. Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the Organizing Authority and if accepted a 20% late entry penalty may be levied in addition to the entry fee.

- 5.3 All entries are asked to declare their sail rating configuration no later than 1700 on Tuesday, May 2, 2023.

- 5.4 For all classes the Entry Fee shall be US \$500 per boat and \$50 per crew member payable on or before 1700 on April 04, 2023.

- 5.5 Registration is mandatory for all entrants and will take place at the Committee Desk at Antigua Yacht Club, Falmouth, from  
9:30 – 12:30 Monday May 8

- 5.6 All competitors will be required to complete a waiver provided by the Organizing Authority prior to the start of racing.

- 5.7 A representative of each competitor shall attend the Skippers' Meeting at Race Headquarters  
17:00 Monday May 8<sup>th</sup>

## **6. MEASUREMENTS AND RATINGS**

- 6.1 All multihull entries must contact a PCS measurer via [www.caribbean-sailing.com](http://www.caribbean-sailing.com) to arrange for measurement and to obtain a rating certificate.
- 6.2 Classic boats will be given a CSA Classic Rating
- 6.3 CSA boats shall have a valid 2023 digitally-certified CSA Rating certificate.
- 6.4 IRC boats shall have a valid 2023 IRC certificate.
- 6.5 Superyachts shall have a valid ORCsy Certificate.
- 6.6 Spirit of Tradition boats shall have a valid ISYR rating.
- 6.7 Boats in all but the IRC Divisions may elect to use auxiliary propulsion during the race. They shall keep a log of their usage. The aggregate time motoring will be multiplied by a Race Factor and added to the base time on course which will then be adjusted by their rating. The race factor will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.

## **7. IDENTIFICATION**

- 7.1 All boats are required to provide their sail numbers before the close of Registration.
- 7.2 All boats without sail numbers will be required to display bow and/or stern numbers for the purposes of identification.

## **8. START**

The race start line will be set off Fort Charlotte, Antigua. The first signal is scheduled for 1155 AST, Tuesday May 9, 2023.

## **9. COURSE**

The course will be from the start to the finish off St. David's Lighthouse, Bermuda, leaving the Islands of Antigua and Bermuda to port, and as defined more specifically in the Sailing Instructions.

## **10. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Sailing Instructions will be distributed at the time of Registration.

## **11. COMMUNICATIONS**

- 11.1 The Sailing Instructions will require yachts to do the following:

- a. mount an automatic transponder (supplied by the OA) properly, and make scheduled reports to the race committee upon notice of the transponder's failure;
  - b. use their best efforts to monitor AIS for AIS-SART or similar distress signals, and enable the transmitting mode of their AIS at all times;
  - c. be capable of receiving voice calls and email via satellite while racing; and
  - d. monitor VHF Ch. 16 throughout the race and VHF 72 for 1 hour before and after the start.
- 11.2 RRS 41, OUTSIDE HELP, which applies while racing, is changed to add (permit): "(e) Help in the form of information freely available to all boats even if that information is only accessible at a cost. However, such 'at a cost' help shall not include private forecast or tactical advice or information customized for a particular boat or group of boats and/or her/their situation. The use of PredictWind's Weather Routing tool is permitted."

## **12. PENALTY SYSTEM.**

- 12.1 The race committee may protest any yacht that has failed to meet any deadline specified in the Notice of race or the sailing instructions.
- 12.2 The penalty, if any, for breaches of the RRS other than Parts 1 and 2 will be at the sole discretion of the International Jury. This changes RRS 44.3(c), RRS 64.2
- 12.3 For protests involving a breach of a rule of Part 2, or 31 of the Rules, an arbitration hearing may be offered prior to a protest hearing. This changes Part 5, Section B of the RRS. If a protest is not withdrawn, it must be heard by the Protest Committee-

## **13. SCORING**

Corrected times will be calculated using the scoring systems and certificates mentioned in NoR 6.

Boats not finishing by 12:00 ADT on Wednesday, May 17, 2023 will be scored DNF.

## **14. PRIZES**

- 14.1 Prizes will be presented to the overall corrected time winner in each class. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
- 14.2 Prize Giving will be on Wednesday May 17, 2023 at the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club or earlier by announcement if a substantial portion of the fleet has finished. Attendance is by invitation only.

## **15. INSURANCE**

- 15.1 Boats must provide at Registration, evidence of Third Party Insurance of at least US\$1 million valid for the duration of the Race.

## 16. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY AND RISK STATEMENT

16.1 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.' Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the race, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk while taking part in the race;
- (b) they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the race and they are fit to participate;
- (e) the provision of a race management team, support boats, judges and other officials and volunteers by the Organising Authority does not relieve the competitor of their own responsibilities and
- (f) The Organizing Authority, RBYC, Antigua Sailing Week, their members and officials will not be liable for damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the Race.
