**NOTICE OF RACE**

**1 RULES AND ADVERTISING**

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the current PHRF Regulations, as administered by the YRA of Long Island Sound (YRALIS) and the United States Sailing Safety Equipment Recommendations, with this event classified as a “Nearshore” event, and or the safety requirements for One Design Classes.
- 1.2 RRS 35 is changed such that boats not completing the course by the time limit will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired).
- 1.3 A boat that is scored TLE, DNF or RET shall be scored point for one more than the last boat to finish within the time limit. This changes A5.2.
- 1.4 PHRF Handicapping shall be calculated based upon “Time on Time”.
- 1.5 The starting sequence shall be in accordance with RRS 26.

**2 DIVISIONS**

There will be two divisions – spinnaker and non-spinnaker. A boat may enter to race in one division. A boat may change her division with the permission of the Principal Race Officer.

**3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

Eligible competitors shall be yachts who have a current YRALIS PHRF Certificate, completed an entry form, and paid the entry fee prior to 1200 on Friday, May 19, 2023. Late entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the Race Committee. Those yachts with invalid or expired certificates shall not be scored.

**4 FEES**

- 4.1 The entry fee will be \$35 per yacht.

**5 SCHEDULE**

- 5.1 There will be skipper's' meeting held at or near the Linburn Terrace of the Seawanhaka Corinthian Yacht Club Main Club at 1030 hours on Saturday, May 20, 2023. The Principal Race Officer reserves the option of holding a competitor’s meeting virtually if conditions preclude a live format. In the event of such an occurrence, entrants will be emailed as to time and platform to be used for such a meeting.
- 5.2 There will be one race.
- 5.3 The first warning signal is scheduled for 1255 for the first division.

**6 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

Sailing instructions and a scratch sheet will be available in print at the competitors’ meeting on the day of the race or from the Signal Boat. Where possible, the scratch sheet will be emailed to entrants. ## **7 VENUE**

The racing area will be on and in the vicinity of Oyster Bay, Cold Spring Harbor, and Long Island Sound.

## **8 COURSES**

Courses will be sailed around fixed marks in Long Island Sound, Cold Spring Harbor and Oyster Bay. The marks and the sequence of rounding shall be listed in the Sailing Instructions. Charts of the marks used and standard course are available on the Seawanhaka website, On The Water, Cruising Class and PHRF Racing web page.

## **9 SCORING**

9.1 The scoring is PHRF "Time on Time" scoring.

9.2 Each Division will be scored separately and all Divisions will be scored together to determine the winner of the Alfred Roosevelt Cup.

## **10 BERTHING**

Competitors may arrange for a complementary mooring by calling the club at 516-922-6200 or the SCYC Launch on Channel 10.

## **11 RADIO COMMUNICATION**

All yachts must have a working VHF Radio.

## **12 PRIZES**

12.1 Prizes will be given for the first-place winner of each division. Additional prizes will be awarded in each division depending on the number of starters. The Alfred Roosevelt Cup will be awarded to the best performance among the PHRF Divisions. The Race Committee will determine the overall winner at its sole discretion; but their consideration shall be based upon the difference, adjusted for handicap, between the winners each division and their respective second place boat.

12.2 All Prizes will be presented at the Seawanhaka Annual Awards Dinner on Saturday, November 4, 2023. All Competitors are invited to the Dinner.

## **13 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY**

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 3; Decision to race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

## **14 INSURANCE**

Each participating yacht shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000.
