

Pursuit of Happiness Regatta

This race is in honor of Tim Price who will be remembered by all in the sailing community.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 RRS Appendix V will apply. RRS Appendix T will apply.
- 1.3 Rule 61 will be changed to require boats to notify the Race Committee immediately after finishing of their intent to protest.
- 1.4 Each boat shall carry a radio capable of transmitting and receiving VHF channel 71.
- 1.5 A Pursuit Starting Sequence will be used. See Attachment P

2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 The regatta is open to keelboats and multi-hulls between 19-80 feet LOA with a YRALIS PHRF BASE RATING less than 228.
- 2.2 Unrated boats will be assigned one-time PHRF ratings by the race organizers and will race against other unrated boats. Depending on the number of entries there may be more than one division.

3 FEES

The entry fee for all classes is \$60. Online entry is required. Completed entries must be received no later than 1200 on July 21, entries received after this date will include a \$25 late fee. Online registration and electronic entry fee payment are available on the regatta website on Yachtscoring.com.

4 RACE FORMAT

- 4.1 The regatta will consist of a short distance one race around government or drop marks.
- 4.2 A pursuit start will be used: See Attachment P

5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 Date of race: Saturday, July 22nd, the first warning is scheduled for 1155 at Can "1" NE of Execution Rocks
- 5.2 Number of races: All classes one race.

6 MEASUREMENTS

- 6.1 All one design and handicap entrants with rating certificates shall register on YachtScoring.com. Ratings for participants with PHRF certificates from outside of the YRALIS, and participants without PHRF certificates, will have PHRF handicaps assigned based upon the available information at the time.
- 6.2 PHRF boats will use their PHRF Distance Rating.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available after no later than 0900, July 10th on Yachtscoring.com

8 VENUE and COURSES

- 8.1 The starting mark and finishing mark will be G Can "1" (0.8nm NNE of Execution Rocks).
- 8.2 The course for the race will be a 10.15 nm course in the waters in the vicinity of Execution Rocks Light honoring specific government marks as per SI 8.3 and SI 8.4.
- 8.3 At 1130, the Race Committee will announce over the designated fleet VHF channel 71 and by flying Flag "C" or "A" from the Signal Boat the direction which the course shall be sailed: Course "C" around the course clockwise, and Course "A" around the course counterclockwise or anti-clockwise.
- 8.4 Marks for the race will be designated as follows:

C - Clockwise G Can "1" (NE of Ex

G Can "1" (NE of Execution Rocks) - Start R "2" (S of Hen and Chickens) - round to Stbd G Can "1" (SE of Delancy Point) - round to Stbd R Bell "42" (S of Scotch Caps) - round to Stbd G Can "1" (W of Weeks Point) - round to Stbd G Gong "23" (N of Prospect Point) - round to Stbd Y "A" (U.Conn. Weather Buoy) - round to Stbd G Can "1" (NE of Execution Rocks) - Finish

A - Anti-Clockwise

G Can "1" (NE of Execution Rocks) - Start
Y "A" (U.Conn. Weather Buoy) - round to Port
G Gong "23" (N of Prospect Point) - round to Port
G Can "1" (W of Weeks Point) - round to Port
R Bell "42" (S of Scotch Caps) - round to Port
G Can "1" (SE of Delancy Point) - round to Port
R "2" (S of Hen and Chickens) - round to Port
G Can "1" (NE of Execution Rocks) - Finish

SCORING - For each class: the first boat to finish will be first; the second boat to finish will be second; the third boat to finish will be third and so forth.

10 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 10.1 The Race Committee may provide general information to competitors on VHF Channel 71. Information so provided will not be subject to action under Rule 62.
- 10.2 Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats.

11 PRIZES

A bottle of wine will be awarded to each class winner. Prizes will be awarded as follows: 1st place in each class with fewer than four participants; 1st and 2nd place in each class with three to four participants; and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place in each class with five or more participants.

12 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

- **13 INSURANCE** Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$100,000 per incident or the equivalent.
- 14 EVENT PARTIES Post-Race BBQ and other shoreside activities are planned, \$20.
