NOTICE OF RACE

The Officers and Members of the Edgartown Yacht Club invite you to participate in the 30th Edgartown Yacht Club Twelve Metre Regatta, to be held on Friday, August 8, Saturday, August 9, and Sunday, August 10, 2025.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The Organizing Authority (OA) is the Edgartown Yacht Club.
- 1.2 The Regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.3 Twelve Metre Yachts will be subject to the International Twelve Metre Class By-Laws & Regulations; by the International Twelve Metre Class Rules; and by any subsequent updates and amendments.

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organizing Authority.
- 2.2 By participating in this Regatta, each competitor grants to the Organizing Authority and its members, the Regatta sponsors, and each class association the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, and to license any other person so to make, show and use, from time to time at their discretion, any photographs, sound recordings, motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television or other reproductions of them or their property made during the period of the Regatta without compensation to such competitor.

3 COMMUNICATIONS

- 3.1 The Official Notice Board shall be located on Yacht Scoring at https://yachtscoring.com/notice_board_summary.cfm
- 3.2 All yachts will be required to carry VHF radios capable of transmitting and receiving on Channels 16, 63, and 72.
- 3.3 On the water, the race committee may make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on VHF radio. The channel will be stated in the SIs.
- 3.4 From the first warning signal of its class until the end of the last race of the day for its class, except in an emergency, a boat intending to race shall not make voice or data transmissions, and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 Boats entered must be owned by, or under charter to, members of US SAILING or yacht clubs affiliated with US SAILING.
- 4.2 The Regatta is open to registered 12 Metre yachts holding a valid certificate and which are current with their International Twelve Metre Class dues, America's Fleet and certificate filing fees.
- 4.3 The Regatta is also open to registered Twelve Metre Spirit yachts, which will compete in a separate class.
- 4.4 Yachts will be raced and scored one-design within their assigned classes unless otherwise stated in the Sailing Instructions.
- 4.5 The Race Committee will publish the breakdown of classes no later than 2000 Wednesday, August 6, 2025.
- 4.6 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration form found at <https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=16894>. The required entry fee must be paid online on or before 1730, Wednesday, August 6, 2025.
- 4.7 A representative from each boat must check in at the Race Office in person or by telephoning 508-627-4364 prior to 1600, Thursday, August 8, 2025.
- 4.8 Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Committee.

5 FEES

The registration fee for each yacht is \$800.00. **A \$100 late registration fee will apply to registrations accepted after 1730 on Wednesday, August 6, 2025.**

There will be no warning signals after 1330 on Sunday.

*Time approximate. The Awards ceremony may be held earlier to help facilitate plans for visiting sailors once the results have been finalized.

6.2 The Race Committee may, at its sole discretion, move the warning signal to as early as 0900 on Sunday. Such change will be posted on the Official Notice Board no later than 1800 on the evening before the change takes effect.

7 MEASUREMENTS

Each yacht shall produce a valid measurement certificate on or before 1730, Wednesday, August 6, 2025. All certificates must be valid for the current year.

8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available on the Official Notice Board no later than 2000, Thursday, August 7, 2025.

9 VENUE

The races will be sailed in the waters north of Edgartown Outer Harbor in Nantucket Sound.

10 THE COURSES

The courses to be sailed will be windward/leeward configurations using government and/or inflated marks at the discretion of the Race Committee.

11 SCORING

The number of races sailed constitutes the series and no score will be excluded. This changes RRS A2.1.

12 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones, PDAs and other electronic devices capable of receiving transmissions originating off the boat.

13 PRIZES

13.1 Prizes will be given for classes with a minimum of three yachts for the combined Friday, Saturday and Sunday series.

13.2 The *Kay Hubner Memorial Trophy* for the best score between the Edgartown Yacht Club entries and the Nantucket Yacht Club entries. The method for determining the winner if the two clubs are represented by yachts racing in different classes will be defined in the Sailing Instructions.

13.3 Additional prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.

13.4 Prizes can be combined or deleted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

14.1 As a condition of entry, each owner, skipper and individual participating crew member shall submit the liability waiver release found online at Yacht Scoring: <https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eid=16894>. The fully executed Liability Waiver Forms shall be submitted prior to racing. Boats shall not be scored unless the required forms have been submitted.

14.2 RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. **Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.** The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the Regatta.

15 **INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be adequately insured with current, valid third-party liability insurance that is appropriate taking into account the value of the boats racing and the type of racing.
