

# Charlottetown Race Week 2017 NOTICE OF RACE July 13th-15th

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the current rules as defined by: The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 (RRS).
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Sail Canada will apply.
- 1.3 All aspects of current CYC bylaws and code of conduct shall apply.
- 1.4 Sail numbers for all yachts shall be consistent with Appendix G, Identification on Sails.
- 1.5 One design class rules shall be in effect for one design classes.
- 1.6 All PHRF yachts shall compete with the equipment that is in compliance of their current PHRF certificate.

## **2 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY**

- 2.1 Charlottetown Race Week 2017 is open to all PHRF and one design keelboats. Eligible competitors may enter in person, online at <a href="https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=4342">https://yachtscoring.com/emenu.cfm?eID=4342</a> or call the office of the Charlottetown Yacht Club P.O. Box 1024, 2 Pownal Street, Charlottetown PEI C1A 7M4 Phone (902) 892-9065, Fax (902) 892 0357
- 2.2 All competitors shall check in at the registration desk to sign 2017 code of conduct and competitors waiver.
- 2.3 All competing yachts shall have proof of valid third party liability insurance with a minimum \$1,000,000 coverage.
- 2.4 All competing yachts shall hold a valid NSYA PHRF rating, boats without a valid NSYA PHRF rating certificate must make arrangements with the Authority for measurement prior to 09:00 July 13th 2017. One Design Fleets must be members that are in good standing with their respective classes.

#### 4 Fleets

4.1 Four or more boats of the same class registered by Thursday July 13th at 0:900 will constitute a fleet. All other boats will sail in their respective PHRF class. Class names and their rating ranges will be posted on the official notice board. Expected that there will be PHRF A, B, C, White Sail Fleets. One Design Fleets Farr30, J29, J70.

#### **5 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

5.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available upon completion of registration at the Charlottetown Yacht Club.

#### 6 VENUE

6.1 The Charlottetown Yacht Club is located at 1 Pownal St Charlottetown, PE. The racing venue is the Hillsborough Bay and Charlottetown Harbour.

#### 7 COURSES

- 7.1 There are two possible course configurations:
  - A) Windward/Leeward. Depending on the conditions the course may be set inside or outside the Charlottetown Harbour. A gate may replace the standard leeward mark; and an offset buoy may be used at the windward mark
  - B) Start in the harbour, race to a predetermined buoy or set mark and possible finish at the Yacht Club finish line.

Warning Signal 1st Race of Day July 13th 11:00

Skippers and Fleet Captains Meeting July 14th, 09:00 CYC Great Hall (all competitors welcome)

Warning Signal 1st Race of Day July 14th 11:00

Skippers meeting and Fleet Captains Meeting July 15th, 09:00 CYC Great Hall (all competitors welcome)

Warning Signal 1st Race of Day July 15th 11:00

No Warning Signal will be made after July 15th 16:00

## 9 SCORING

- 9.1 The low point system of Appendix A will apply. Nine races are scheduled of which one race must be completed to constitute a series.
- 9.2 When fewer than five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of race scores.
- 9.3 When from five to nine races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of race scores excluding their worst score.

## 10 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

10.1 All Competitors that participate in the regatta do so entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The CYC and the Race week organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

## 11 RADIO COMMUNICATION

11.1 All Vessels shall carry on board a functioning VHF radio. Except in an emergency or communication by the Race committee, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communication not available to all other boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones and other communication devices.

### 12 DIVING AND HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 12.1 No boats shall be hauled out during the regatta without valid reason and permission from the race committee.
- 12.2 No underwater breathing apparatus or plastic pools or their equivalent shall be used during the duration of the regatta.

#### 13 PRIZES

13.1 1st, 2nd, 3rd for each fleet and presented at awards ceremony

#### 14 RIGHTS TO USE NAME AND LIKENESS

14.1 In participating in the event, a competitor automatically grants to the Organizing authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.
