# SPERRY CHARLESTON RACE WEEK

# April 11,12, 13 and 14, 2019 NOTICE OF RACE

The organizing authority of Sperry Charleston Race Week is the Charleston Ocean Racing Association.

#### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), The 2019 ORC Rules, and the Sperry Charleston Race Week (SCRW) PHRF procedures.
- 1.2 The Equipment Rules of Sailing will apply.
- 1.3 The protest committee may impose penalties less than disqualification (DPI) for violations of the class rules and racing rules other than those of RRS Part 1 and Part 2. This changes RRS 64.1(a).
- 1.4 The International J/70 Class Event Rules Part III (sections I.3 and I.4) will apply.
- 1.5 RRS Appendix G3 (CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS) will apply.
- 1.6 RRS Appendix T (ARBITRATION) will apply.
- 1.7 The sailing instructions may also change other racing rules.
- 1.8 If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

## 2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Boats may be required to display identification numbers and sponsor's advertising for the duration of the event in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20. These items will be supplied free of charge by the organizing authority (OA) at registration.
- 2.2 Boats not bearing the event bow sticker on both sides are subject to protest by the race committee only.
- 2.3 Competitors are requested to respect the brand exclusivity of our Official Sponsors; their participation enhances the event for all competitors.

# 3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

3.1 Sperry Charleston Race Week is open to one-design keelboats between 19-85 feet LOA; ORC, and PHRF monohull boats that are 24-85 feet LOA, and multi-hulls 24-70 feet LOA between hull perpendiculars.

- 3.3 PHRF Consortium, will assign PHRF ratings for this event. The procedures to be followed to obtain an event specific rating are described in the SCRW PHRF procedures, which can be found on the event website.
- 3.4 ORC entries with a valid ORC certificate are invited. 2019 ORCi or ORC Club certificates will be accepted. It is the intent to structure ORC class limits to create the fairest possible racing among boats of similar size and type. However, the exact limits cannot be defined until 2019 ratings are available in January, when an amendment will be issued to describe these classes.

For more information, contact your national rating office or visit www.orc.org. USA PHRF boats are invited to obtain ORC Club certificates by applying for a certificate online at: www.orc.org/clubapplication.

- 3.5. One-Design starts on Circles 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be provided when there are twelve (12) or more entries for a class. Smaller classes may be combined to consolidate starting sequences. The maximum number of entries for single class start is limited to the first 60 (sixty) completed entries (to include all fees) accepted on a time priority basis ("first-come, first served basis"). Completed entries received beyond the sixty-boat limit will be recorded on a waiting list. If the number of boats entered fall below the sixty-boat limit prior to the entry deadline, entry will be offered to boats on the waiting list in time priority order.
- 3.5.1 One-Design starts (J/70) on Circle 2. The maximum number of entries is limited to the first 100 completed entries (to include all fees) accepted on a time priority basis ("first come, first served basis"). Completed entries received more than the one hundred-boat limit will be recorded on a waiting list. If the number of boats entered falls below the one hundred-boat limit prior to the entry deadline, entry will be offered to boats on the waiting list in time priority order. If more than 60 boats are registered, the fleet will be divided to accommodate a rotation as described in the sailing instructions with two separate starts on the same race circle.
- 3.6 Pursuit Classes. Boats will be divided into spinnaker and non-spinnaker divisions.
- 3.6.1 Boats that have a displacement length ratio under 200 or an upwind sail area to displacement ratio of 17.5 or higher will sail in a separate class referred to the high performance class and will utilize ORC time on time scoring. Displacement and sail area ratios, we be those published by US Sailing. Entry to the Pursuit Class will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- 3.7 Multi-hull Classes. A multi-hull class using PHRF or Class rules will be provided if there is sufficient interest.
- 3.8 Offshore Classes. Boats shall be suitable for offshore sailing. Boats shall have a minimum length of 24 feet. The maximum allowable boat shall not have LOA greater than 70 feet. A minimum of five boats is needed to provide a start on one of the offshore circles.

### 4. CREW LIMITS

- 4.1 All boats shall race with the same number of crew in all races on circles 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Any request for changes in the number of crew shall be submitted to the Race Director via email to info@charlestonraceweek.com before 0700 on the day of the race.
- 4.2 Circle 6/Pursuit Class only: Boats may vary the number of crew from day to day. Boats shall declare to the RC/OA the number of persons on board and the names of the crew before 0700 on each race day. The crew list may be sent via email to info@charlestonraceweek.com.

# 5. OTHER RULES & REQUIREMENTS

- 5.1 All boats shall carry an operating VHF radio.
- 5.2 All boats shall be sailed by at least three persons on Circles 1 through 5 and two persons for Course 6 (Pursuit Class) and VX One class.
- 5.3 At all times, boats shall monitor and keep clear of commercial traffic. Boats that hinder commercial traffic to the point of five horns shall be subject to protest by the race committee.

### 6. FEES

6.1 Registrations are not complete without payment of the entry fee.
The entry fees are based on the LOA and are as follows:

Tier 1 (19)	\$450.00
Tier 2 (20'-24')	\$500.00
Tier 3 (25'-34')	\$525.00
Tier 4 (35'-44')	\$575.00
Tier 5 (45'-85')	\$600.00

A boats LOA is to be rounded to the lower whole number (i.e. 29.01' =29' and 29.99' = 29') for determining entry fees.

- 6.2 Cancellation Fee: All registrations shall be complete and final. Cancellations prior to March 17, 2019.
- 6.3 Non- US Sailing members shall add \$25.00 to the entry fee. Members shall include the membership number for proof of membership.
- 6.4 Shoreside Passes: The Shoreside Event Pass provides entry to the Race Village April 11-14, 2019 and includes cocktails on the beach Thursday Saturday, a Friday buffet, the Sunday afternoon beer and chili cookout plus trophy presentations, prizes, sponsor demonstrations, music and more. No meal is served on Saturday so that you may venture out to one of the many Charleston and Mount Pleasant area restaurants for dinner.

A Race Week Shoreside Event Pass will be required for each person's participation in any of the event's shoreside activities. Two Shoreside Event Passes will be provided with your boat's registration fee. Additional Shoreside Event Passes may be per purchased online until April 7, 2019 for \$85.00 or \$95.00 on-site thereafter. Daily and children passes will be available on-site for visitors and those wishing to only attend one evening.

7.2 On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 1400.

#### 8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Sailing Instructions will be available after April 10, 2019 on the event website. Copies will be distributed during check-in.

#### 9. VENUE AND THE COURSES

The regatta site for Sperry Charleston Race Week will be the Charleston Harbor and the Atlantic Ocean.

- 9.1 Attachment A shows the approximate location of the racing areas.
- 9.1.1 Inshore Race Courses Circles 1, 2, 3 and 4
- 9.1.2 Ocean Race Courses Circle 5
- 9.1.3 The Pursuit Classes will sail course area 6 and shall comply with WS Offshore Special Regulations Category 4 requirements. Plan to sail a longer single race per day around government buoys both inshore and offshore.

- 9.2 Courses for each race area circle will be defined in the Sailing Instructions.
- 9.2.1 Races on Circles 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be windward/leeward set by the Race Committee.
- 9.2.2 Races on Circle 5 may be windward/leeward as set by the Race Committee. In addition, the final race of the day may have windward/leeward legs followed by a distance leg that will finish inshore near the CHR&M. If a northeast breeze creates a sea state that is too difficult to manage a course, a course may be set inshore north of the Ravenel Bridge on the Wando river.
- 9.2.3 Races on Course 6 (Pursuit Class) will be point to point type racing.
- 9.3 The ORC and select one design classes sailing on the offshore circle (Circle 5) shall comply with WS Offshore Special Regulations Category 4 requirements. For more information, refer to http://www.sailing.org/specialregs

#### 10. PENALTY SYSTEM

The US Sailing prescription RRS Appendix V (ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES) will apply.

#### 11. SCORING

- 11.1 A maximum of eight races are scheduled for the offshore circle and a maximum of ten races are scheduled for the inshore circles, one of which shall be completed to constitute a series.
- 11.2 If five or fewer races are completed, the score for each boat will be the sum of the scores for all races sailed; if six or more races are completed one race will be discarded from each boat's score. This changes RRS A2. A minimum of one race per day shall be completed, for daily trophies to be awarded. ORC classes will be scored with the Triple Number ORC ratings for Windward/Leeward or Coastal /Long Distance courses using time on time scoring. Course 7 may be scored using a constructed course rating. Prior to the warning signal the RC will announce its intention to use the Low, Medium, or High wind rating for scoring the race. Attention is drawn to ORC Rating Rule 403.4: "The Race Committee shall signal before the start the wind range to be used for scoring, but it may change this in case of significant change in the weather conditions." Explanations of ORC scoring options can be found at www.orc.org/scoring.

#### 12. SUPPORT BOATS

- 12.1 Entries utilizing coach/support boats shall register with the Race Committee at registration and have and have those vessels marked with an identifying flag.
- 12.2 Support boats shall remain no less than 150 yards from the race course from preparatory signal until all boats have finished or retired or the race committee signals postponement, general recall or abandonment.
- 12.3 Failure of a support to register, or a breach of NOR 12.2 shall be considered a breach of RRS 2 (Fair Sailing), by the boats associated with support, and is subject to protest. The penalty applied to the boat or boats associated with the support boat shall be at the discretion of the protest committee and shall not be excluded from their score. This changes RRS 64.1(c) and A2.
- 12.4 Support boats shall carry a VHF radio tuned to the designated race committee VHF channel for the circle they are nearest to.
- 12.5 Support drivers shall have valid third-party liability insurance or the equivalent and provide proof upon request by the race committee or organizing authority.
- 12.6 J/70 Class only SUPPORT BOATS
  - Individual support or coach boats shall not have contact of any nature, including:
  - (i) communication by radio, telephone, internet, vocal signal, visual signaling of any kind (i.e., tactical placement, use of flags and/or distinct colors of clothing) or
  - (ii) the transfer of crew, equipment or supplies, with a registered racing boat from the time the boat leaves its dock or mooring each day until the boat has finished racing for the day.
  - Not withstanding the foregoing, late arriving crew, food and drink may be transferred to a racing boat prior to the first race of the day, and
  - (iii) crew may be transferred in the event of an unforeseen personal emergency. Infringements of this rule will result in a penalty to the boat associated with the support boat. Such penalty may be either penalties or disqualification at the discretion of the protest.

#### 13. BERTHING/SLIPS/DOCKING

#### 14. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS

Boats shall not be hauled out during the regatta except with and according to the terms of prior written permission from the Race Director. The VX One class is exempt due to limited docking space.

# 15. RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 15.1 All boats shall carry an operating VHF radio.
- 15.2 Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

#### 16. PRIZES

- 16.1 ORC: One daily award in each class for each day of racing. One overall trophy will be awarded in each class for every three boats entered up to a maximum of three trophies per class. The entry that wins the most competitive class will receive the recognition on the Palmetto Cup Perpetual Trophy.
- One Design Classes: One daily award in each class for each day of racing. One overall trophy will be awarded in each class for every three boats entered up to a maximum of three trophies per class. Additional Corinthian awards will be made available for the classes recognizing Corinthian teams within their class. The entry that wins the most competitive class will receive the recognition on the Charleston Race Week Cup Perpetual Trophy.
- 16.3 PHRF: One daily trophy will be awarded for each day of racing to each class. One overall trophy will be awarded for every three boats entered to a maximum of the three trophies in each class.
- 16.4 Jubilee Sportsmanship Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the participant who has displayed outstanding example of good sportsmanship during Sperry Charleston Race Week. Ballots will be available for all participants.

#### 17. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 17.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. (See RRS 4, DECISION TO RACE). The Organizing Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 17.2 The safety of a boat and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the Skipper who shall ensure that the boat is fully sound, thoroughly seaworthy, and manned by an experienced and physically able crew. Neither the establishment of regulations or inspection of a boat in any way limits or reduces the complete and unlimited responsibility of the Skipper.
- 17.3 Charleston Ocean Racing Association, Sponsors of the Sperry Charleston Race Week, their employees and volunteers do not accept responsibility for the loss of life or injury to participants or others, or for the loss or damage to any vessel in any way or from any cause during or relating to this event.
- 17.4 The Skipper shall be responsible for the conduct of his crew. In the event of a serious breach of conduct, the destruction of property or the failure to comply with a reasonable request of any Race Officer or Committee Member, the Skipper will be responsible for all damages and the boat may be subject to protest, which may include disqualification from the regatta.

# 18. INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid, third party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 USD per event or the equivalent.

# 19. AMENDMENTS TO THE NOTICE OF RACE

Any amendments to notice of race will be posted on the event's Yacht Scoring website.

#### 20. GENERAL INFORMATION

- 20.1 Periodic updates and latest information on the event will be posted on the Sperry Charleston Race Week website: www.charlestonraceweek.com
- 20.2 Event Race Headquarters will be at the Charleston Harbor Resort and Marina (CHR&M) located at 20 Patriots Point Road, Mount Pleasant, SC 29464. The CHR&M website is www.charlestonharborresort.com. The Race Village will be located at CHR&M. Registration and the Skippers Meeting on Thursday will be at the Lookout Pavillion. The Awards on Sunday will be in the Race Village. The official notice board will be in the Race Village. To facilitate communications to the competitors, information related to this event may be posted in other areas, but there is only one official notice board.
- 20.3 Storage, launching, Retrieving and Setup Pre- and post-race storage details will be posted on the the event website under logistics. Several local yacht clubs and boatyards are available for storage, launching and retrieving. Greater details are available on the event website.


