NOTICE OF RACE

1) RULES

i. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2020 ("RRS"), the prescriptions of US SAILING, any modifications or stated exceptions thereto, class rules for any one-design class competing, the Notice of Expectations and these Sailing Instructions.

2) OTHER RULES and REQUIREMENTS

- i. All boats must be sailed by a minimum of two sailors.
- ii. There are no weight limitations (unless otherwise prescribed by the class rules for any one-design class competing).

3) ADVERTISING

- i. The Cup will be sailed in accordance with ISAF Regulation 20.3.1(b)
- ii. Vessels may be asked to display a sponsor's flag provided by the Organizing Authority as permitted by ISAF regulation 20.3 (d)(i)

4) ELIGIBILITY

- i. The regatta is open to Catboats at least 18 feet LOA and other boats at least 22 feet LOA which either (i) carry a PHRF rating, (ii) fall within the categories of Classic boats, as defined, and carry a CRF rating or (iii) are a one-design class.
- ii. If entries in any Division warrant, a Division will be divided into Classes to be established at the sole discretion of the Organizing Authority and designated based on one-design class, rating and/or hull material or configuration or any combination thereof.
- iii. Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration form and paying the entry fee online ENTER ONLINE. All boats except the Catboat Divisions must submit a 2019 rating certificate for the Division in which they are registered. Entries and payment may also be sent to Sail Martha's Vineyard, P.O. Box 1998, Vineyard Haven, Massachusetts 02568.
- iv. Entries must be received by 1800 hrs July 11, 2019.

 NOTE: Sail Martha's Vineyard may in its sole discretion accept any late entry at any time. A \$100 late entry fee will apply.
- v. A 2019 PHRF certificate can be applied for through the Sail Martha's Vineyard Fleet. (Application available at www.phrfne.org.) Complete application, pay and submit on the PHRF-NE website.

5) <u>CLASSIFI</u>CATION

- i. The *Classic Division* is for sailing yachts that have a full keel, are of heavy to moderate displacement, are built of wood or steel and be of traditional rig and appearance.
 - a. Old craft using modern materials such as epoxy or glass sheathing, or new craft built along the lines of an old design are acceptable.
 - b. Fiber glass yachts should have a full long keel with a keel hung rudder and be a descendant of a wooden boat design.
 - c. Yachts built of other materials may be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Authority, if they have a gaff or traditional schooner rig.
- ii. The *PHRF Non-Spinnaker Division*: A 2019 PHRF-NE Certificate MUST be presented. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.
- iii. The *PHRF Spinnaker Division*: A 2019 PHRF-NE Certificate MUST be presented. THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS.
- iv. Catboats of at least 18 feet are eligible for the Catboat Division
- v. Any one design class that has at least six boats registered may petition the Organizing Authority to designate it as a separate class. Such class, if constituted, will start with its appropriate Division/Class.

9) SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

 Sailing Instructions for the PHRF, IRC, Classic and Catboat Divisions will be posted on the Vineyard Cup website, <u>www.vineyardcup.com</u> beginning at 0900 hours July 13, 2019. There will be no paper copies made available by Sail Martha's Vineyard.

10) RACE HEADQUARTERS

i. Race Headquarters will be located at the Sail Martha's Vineyard's offices at 79 Beach Road in Vineyard Haven.

11) RACE COURSES

COURSE #1 THE DASH

(approximately 5.2 nm)

Start, then through the N"4" - C" 23A" gate to G "23" (leave to port) to RG N (leave to port) through N'4" - C "23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE # 2 THE DASH PLUS

(approximately 7.6 nm)

Start, then through the N"4" - C" 23A" gate to G "23" (leave to port) to C "15" (leave to port) through the N'4" - C "23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE #3 HEDGE FENCE COURSE

(approximately 9.9 nm)

Start, then through the N"4" - C" 23A" gate to G "23" (leave to starboard) to R "22" (leave to starboard) to GR Bell (leave to starboard) to G "23" (leave to port) through the N"4" - C" 23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE #4 L'HOMMEDIEU SHOAL COURSE

(approximately 10.8 nm)

Start, then through the N"4" - C" 23A" gate to C"25" (leave to port) to R"26" (leave to starboard) to C"15" at the western end of L'Hommedieu Shoal (leave to starboard) to RG N at the west end of Hedge Fence (leave to starboard) through the N"4" - C "23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE # 5 NORTH CHANNEL COURSE

(approximately 10.9 nm)

Start, then through the N "4" – G"23A gate to N "14" (leave to starboard) to G "23" (leave to starboard) to R "2" (leave to port) through the N "4" – C"23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE # 6 VINEYARD SOUND COURSE SHORT

(approximately 12.1 nm)

Start, then through the N "4" – C"23A gate to C "25" (leave to port) to R "26" (leave to port) to G "27" (leave to port) to C "25" (leave to starboard) through the N "4" – C"23A gate to Finish.

COURSE #7 AROUND HEDGE FENCE COURSE

(approximately 15.4 nm)

Start, then through the N "4" – C"23A gate to RG N (leave to starboard) to C "11" (leave to starboard to R "22" (leave to starboard) to GR Bell (leave to starboard) to G "23" (leave to port) through the N "4" – C"23A gate to Finish.

COURSE #8 LUCAS SHOAL COURSE

(approximately 21.3 nm)

Start through the N"4" – C"23A" gate to R "2" (leave to port) to C "25" (leave to port) to G "27 (leave to port) to GR C "LS" at Lucas Shoal (leave to port) to C "25" (leave to starboard) to R "2" (leave to starboard) through the N"4" – G"23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE # 9 VINEYARD SOUND COURSE LONG

(approximately 21.7 nm)

Start, then through the N"4" – C"23A" gate to C "25" (leave to port) to R "26" (leave to port) to G "27" (leave to port) to C"25" (leave to port) to R"26" (leave to port) to G"27" (leave to port) to C"25" (leave to starboard) through the N"4" – C"23A" gate to Finish.

COURSE #10 THE RACE TO THE ROCK...AND BACK (approximately 29.1 nm)

Start, then through the N"4" – C"23A" gate to C"25" (leave to port) to GR Lone Rock at the north entrance to Quicks Hole (leave to starboard) to C"25" (leave to starboard) through the N"4" – C"23A" gate to Finish. Skippers may approach and return from Lone Rock by any course they choose. Passage through Wood's, Robinson's or Quick's Holes in either direction is permitted. Extreme caution, good seamanship and sound judgment are strongly recommended when determining a vessel's course and passage.

NOTES:

- The course for each Class will be designated by the appropriate number displayed on a white board on the starboard side of the Committee Boat. If a course designation is followed by "R", the course is to be sailed in the opposite order as described above and marks are to be left on the opposite side.
- ALL BOATS SHOULD TREAT N"4" AND C"23A" AS A GATE AND SHALL PASS BETWEEN THEM OUTBOUND FROM THE START LINE AND INBOUND TO THE FINISH LINE. THERE ARE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS REQUIREMENT.

12) SCORING and ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

- i. Each Division and Class will be scored separately for the purpose of awards
- ii. Time-over-distance ratings developed by the Race Committee to the best of its ability and in the recreational spirit of the Classic Division will be assigned to each boat entered in that Division.

- iii. PHRF NE ratings will be used for the PHRF Spinnaker and Non-Spinnaker Divisions. A valid PHRF NE 2019 certificate for each boat entered must be on file with the Race Committee.
- iv. No score will be excluded in any Division or Class scoring. This changes Rule A2
- v. RRS 44.3 (c), Scoring Penalty shall be **20%** of the number of boats registered in a Division for divisional scoring and in a Class for class scoring

13) PRIZES

- i. Trophies will be awarded at 5pm on Sunday as follows:
 - a. In the **CLASSIC DIVISION**...The **DANA FAMILY CUP, a perpetual trophy** for the boat with the best cumulative, corrected finishing place. Second and third place trophies will also be awarded.
 - b. In the **PHRF NON-SPINNAKER DIVISION**...The **VINEYARD CUP TROPHY** for the boat with the best cumulative, corrected finishing places for Friday and Saturday's races and on actual finishing place in her Class for Sunday's pursuit race
 - c. In the **PHRF NON-SPINNAKER DIVISION**...The **DONALD S. COHAN TROPHY** "The Methuselah" for the boat with the oldest skipper with the best combined corrected finishing places.
 - d. In the PHRF SPINNAKER DIVISION...The VINEYARD CHALLENGE TROPHY for the boat with the best cumulative, corrected finishing places based on corrected times for Friday and Saturday's races and on actual finishing place in her Class for Sunday's pursuit race
 - e. First, second and third place trophies in each PHRF Non-Spinnaker Class
 - f. First, second and third place trophies in each PHRF Spinnaker Class
 - g. First, second and third place trophies in the Catboat Division

14) SHORESIDE PARTIES

- i. The 2019, 28th Annual Seafood Buffet will be held on Thursday, July 11th starting at 1700 hours at the Tisbury Wharf
- ii. There will be harbor-side parties on Friday, Saturday and Sunday in the Race Village located at the Martha's Vineyard Shipyard. Food, Beverage, Music, Daily Awards and Sponsor Handouts will all be part of the fun. Great food and drink for those who have purchased daily or weekend Race Village bracelets. The doors will open at 4pm with food being served from 6 to 6.45. On the Saturday night, there will an extension to the evening's entertainment, with another band playing from 8pm until 10. Entry will be available on our website or at the door. Entry will award each ticket holder over the age of 21 four complementary drinks.

15) LOCALLY SOURCED ZERO WASTE REGATTA

i. The Vineyard Cup Regatta will be sailed pursuant to the Notice of Expectations which sets forth the environmental standards by which the event will be run and Sail Martha's Vineyard's expectations of the competitors as they relate to environmental practices.

16) **LIABILITY**

i. The safety of a boat and its crew is the sole and inescapable responsibility of the Skipper/Owner who must ensure that his boat is fully sound, thoroughly seaworthy and crewed by an

- experienced and physically capable crew. The decision of whether or not to start or continue a race is solely that of the Skipper.
- ii. The Skipper/Owner of each boat participating in the Vineyard Cup Regatta shall be responsible for the behavior of each member of the crew of his/her boat, both while on the water and ashore.
- iii. Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of injury, death and/or damage to equipment. Competitors in this event are competing entirely at their own risk (*see* RRS Decision to Race). Sail Martha's Vineyard (including its officers, directors and staff), the participating Sponsors and Industry Partners of the 2019 Vineyard Cup, the race committee, volunteers, officials and protest committee do not accept responsibility or liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in in any way in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the Vineyard Cup.

17) RADIO COMMUNICATION

i. Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

18) AMENDMENTS TO THIS NOTICE

i. Sail Martha's Vineyard reserves the right to amend this Notice of Race. Any amendments of the NOR will be (i) posted on the Vineyard Cup www.vineyardcup.com and Sail Martha's Vineyard www.sailmv.org websites and (ii) sent to all boats registered at that time.
